This workshop will examine scientific inquiry – how scientists "do" science – and focus on how you can bring your natural expertise in inquiry to education activities. If you are looking to meet requirements by funding agencies to demonstrate the **broader impact** of your research and want to address important science education needs, this workshop is for you.

The workshop will provide participants with:

- an overview of the research on inquiry teaching and learning,
- an introduction to national standards for inquiry-based K-12 science education, and
- real-life examples of how inquiry looks in action.

Education and outreach professionals will be available to discuss specific ways you can get involved in E&O programs.
